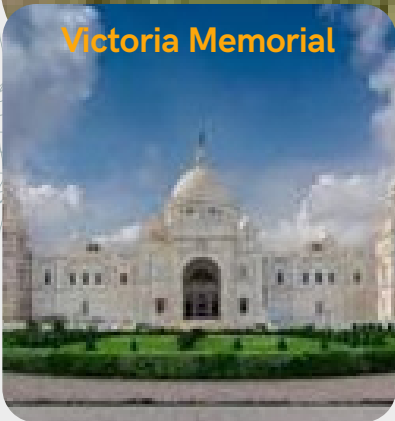
Weather

The end of June in Kolkata marks the active monsoon season. While the 2026 seasonal outlook points toward a potentially weaker or "patchy" start to the monsoon in East India due to evolving El Niño conditions, you can still expect significant humidity and frequent rain. Temperature: Daily highs are projected to be around 31°C to 34°C (88°F–93°F), with overnight lows near 27°C (81°F). RealFeel: High humidity levels (averaging 81–82%) will likely make the daytime heat feel much more intense, often exceeding 40°C (104°F). Rainfall: There is a 66–67% probability of precipitation on these specific days. Localised thunderstorms or "Kalbaishakhi"-style evening rain are common during this transition.

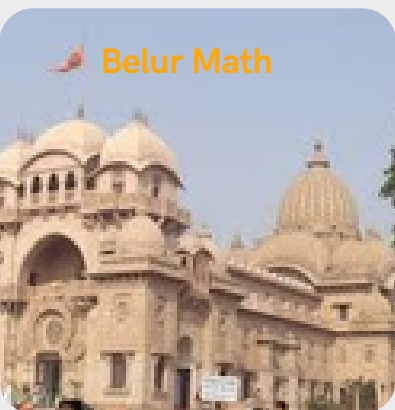

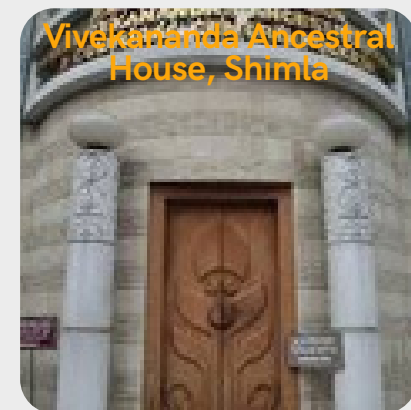
