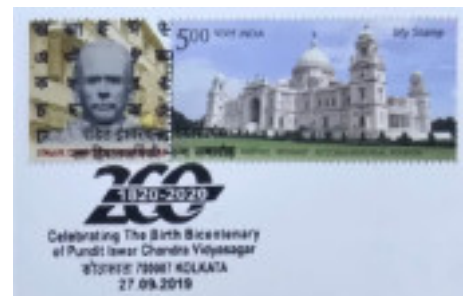

The prophet and founder of the Institution (1859, in the form of Calcutta Training College) Pundit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar was a great fighter of intellectual freedom and had founded the College for the noblest cause of dissemination of higher education among the middle class and the poor at an affordable expense – for the Indians and by the Indians. The college has always tried to abide by two most important visions of IswarchandraVidyasagar –
‘Mass Education’ & ‘Women’s Education’

Vidyasagar College came into being as Metropolitan Institution in the year 1872. Vidyasagar College emerged as the first private college in the Presidency of Bengal, established at a time, when the British Colonial rulers were keen to establish their cultural dominance over the sub-continent to complement the political, social and economic hegemony on this rich land of ours. This institution aimed at disseminating higher education to the needy students at a meager cost, without taking any aid from the colonial rulers.

It is the first college in Asia which was founded by an Indian. The 143 years voyage commenced with only 5 departments i.e. Sanskrit, English, Philosophy, Economics and History (General) having approximately 50 students only. Today we have more than 3500 students pursuing both General and Honours curricula in as many as 20 departments along with two Post Graduate departments. A creditable job is done by the institution in enhancing infrastructure and in the field of curricular and co-curricular activities

The genesis of Vidyasagar College is a momentous and happy event in the National history of India, as its parturition midwife by none other than Pundit Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar - the torch bearer of Indian Renaissance, took place in 1872 in the form of the Metropolitan Institution.

In this backdrop he set out to form a college that was run by the natives, with no help from the ruling British in shape or form. In fact, this college is the first one in India under the British yoke to be run entirely indigenously- the first attempt to free ourselves, in thought and practice, the first cry of freedom.

In accordance with the ideals set by Pundit Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar and following the motto of knowledge, sacrifice and service the college aims to provide the best education possible to students coming from diverse backgrounds. As the founder sought to promote higher education as a part of his philanthropic social reform program, the college continues to make available special welfare and aid to backward and deprived sections of the society as well. It seeks to provide an environment of learning which is beyond the boundaries of caste, religion and gender. The students are exposed to structured learning through the college curriculum. They are offered guidance and suggestions to help them solve problems and are encouraged to acquire high academic standards. They are made aware of their moral responsibilities in a fast-changing multicultural world, and strengthened to surmount the evils of irrationality and intolerance.

The foremost mission of Pundit Vidyasagar was to establish a completely national educational institution in the growing metropolis of the then Calcutta. It was Vidyasagar who was able to unite the western inquisitiveness and religious search for perfection in the realm of knowledge, with the tenderness and sympathetic warmth of the Indian heart.

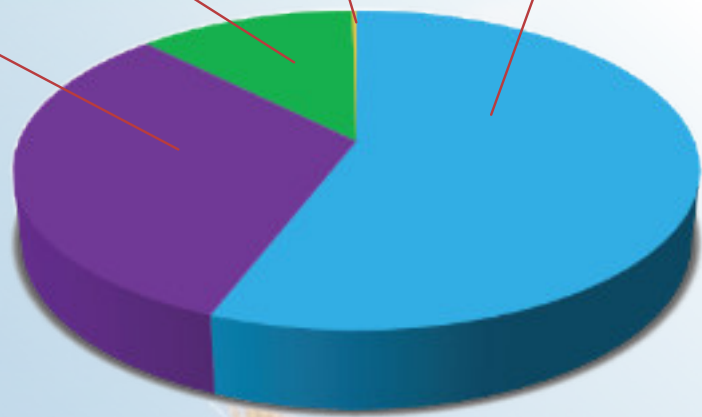

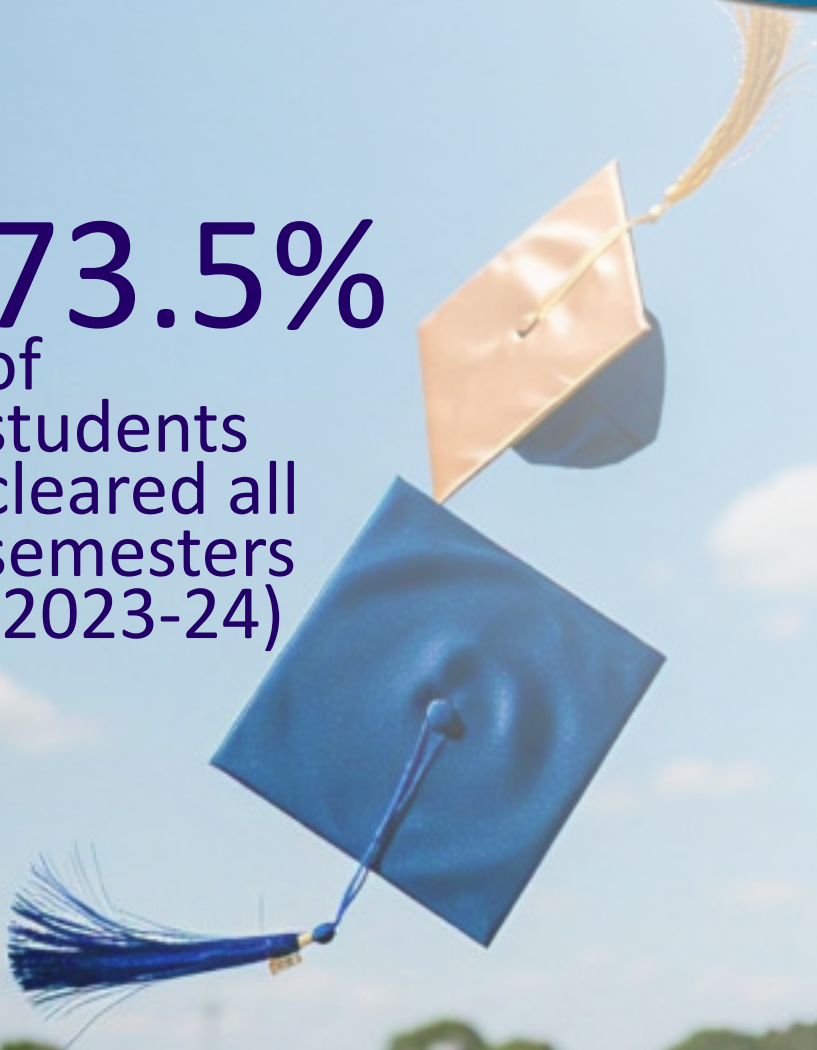

About The Department

Department of Biochemistry aims to train the Undergraduate students to excel in higher studies and in biological research. We motivate our students to serve the society in medical research, drug designing, diagnosis of diseases, mechanism of action of various microorganisms. Every year a good number of students frame their career in biological research in IITs, IISc, TIFR CCMB, ISI, SINP, IICB, IACS as well as various prestigious universities of US and Europe.

History of Department

Department of Biochemistry was established in the year 2007 with a major initiative taken up by the faculties of Department of Chemistry, Vidyasagar College and the Governing body. Initially the faculties of Chemistry Department reached out their hands of cooperation to teach the students of the budding Department.

Dr. Subarna Gupta joined the Department as HOD and is still serving her duty as HOD. Initially only four students were admitted in 2007 and all of them have achieved their Ph D degrees. Dr Anirban Roy of the first batch, stood 2nd in the University and is now pursuing his Post Doctoral Researchship in Houston University and presently working as Research Assistant Professor in the same university. The University of Calcutta has increased the student strength upto 35 and we are getting good number of students each year.

Right now, the Department has four faculty members- Dr. Subarna Gupta, Dr. Purba Konar, Dr. Rozi Ghosh and Dr. Jayeeta Bardhan Dasgupta. The faculty members are dedicated and serving their level best not only to excel the students in the field of education but also as a good human being who will serve the society and the nation. The Department is very fortunate that every year we get intelligent, hardworking and motivated students and also hope for the same in future. Initially the Department started with one laboratory and one teacher's room.

Within one year we got another laboratory. All the instruments and chemicals required to perform the experiments according to the syllabus were purchased by the approval from the Governing body of the College. The Department became self sufficient within two years and is serving as University Centre for Undergraduate Practical Examination from 2010 onwards.

About The Department

The Department of Botany has 8 faculty members and two non-teaching staff. The highly experienced teaching staff have expertise in various fields such as Plant Biotechnology, Microbiology, Taxonomy & Biosystematics, Cytogenetics, Plant Physiology, Biochemistry, Plant Molecular Biology, Ecology, Mycology, Pathology, Algology etc. Teachers have noteworthy publications, books and book chapters to their credit and are ever -striving to keep themselves updated with the changing times. The department has an independent Seminar Library with selected copies of useful books of wide coverage, pertaining to the syllabus of University of Calcutta (CBCS and CCF). The department has two well-equipped laboratories with instruments, glasswares and other items for basic and advanced experiments in different spheres of Plant Science. A list of such instruments is given below for ready reference: UV Spectrophotometer, Laminar air flow, Colorimeter, Centrifuge, Incubator, Autoclave, Shaker, Water distillation plant, pH meter, Digital balance & Pan balance, Overhead projector, Hand microtome, Binocular microscope with digital camera analysis software, Camera, Desktop & Laptop computers.

We are impressed by the performances of several of our students of both Honours and General courses in Calcutta University Examinations. Among the notable alumni, the names of Professor Nirmalendu Samajpati, Professor Nanda Dulal Paria, Professor Partha Deb Ghosh are worth mentioning for their remarkable contributions in the fields of Mycology, Plant Taxonomy and Cytogenetics. Many of our students have secured First class marks in the University examinations and some have migrated overseas for higher studies. Many have got suitable placements in India, in academics, banking sectors, corporate sectors etc.

Besides conducting regular educational tour to different phyto-geographical regions of India with the students, the department hosts regular Seminars, poster presentations by students, exhibition of herbarium specimens etc. A departmental seminar would be organized by end of January and many other activities of academic interest are now in the pipeline. We are making all efforts to take matters onwards and upwards.

History of Department

While rummaging through the archives, we came to know that Science Society was founded on 27th march 1933 in our college. Prof Alok K. Sen, Prof Dharendra Chandra Ray, Prof Haraprasad De took the initiative to set up the society. The department hosted its first seminar in 1937. The first Scientific exhibition was organized by Science Society from 29th July to 1st August 1940. Dr. K.S. Krishnan, Dr. Shyamaprasad Mukherjee attended the exhibition. The meetings of the Science society were addressed by eminent scientists notably Dr. S.K. Mitra (1937), H.K Nandi (1937), P.C. Mitra (1939), Dr. Meghnad Saha (1939), Dr. K.S. Krishnan (1940). The most spectacular exhibit at the exhibition was Phantom Flower- A masterpiece of Optical jugglery. This was also the centre stage of attention.

The Centenary block of the department was built much later in 1959 with financial assistance from The University Grants Commission. This was inaugurated on 25th December 1959 by Professor N.K. Siddhanta, the then Vice Chancellor of University of Calcutta.

Needless to state, our department can boast of a glorious past with its crew of erudite professors, whose academic excellence coupled with unmatched performance is quite something to be proud of.

About The Department

The founding of Metropolitan College in 1872, later named as Vidyasagar College in 1917, was a true representation of nationalist spirit of the great founder of the college, Pundit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar.

Teaching Chemistry at Metropolitan College started at 1885, almost from inception of the college and in those days, Chemistry was taught as a part of 'Material and Moral Science'. In 1908, the College got permission for starting Chemistry as one of the subjects in F.A. class, from University of Calcutta. Then in 1910, Chemistry was introduced in B.A. class. Honours course in Chemistry as a Science subject started in June, 1926. In 1934, after almost nine years of unrelenting labour of both teachers and students, the Department was able to produce the first class I Honours Graduate, Amiya Kumar Mitra and since then, the Department gave birth to a galaxy of notable persons who played vital roles in different spheres of national life for regeneration of India and education of the youth.

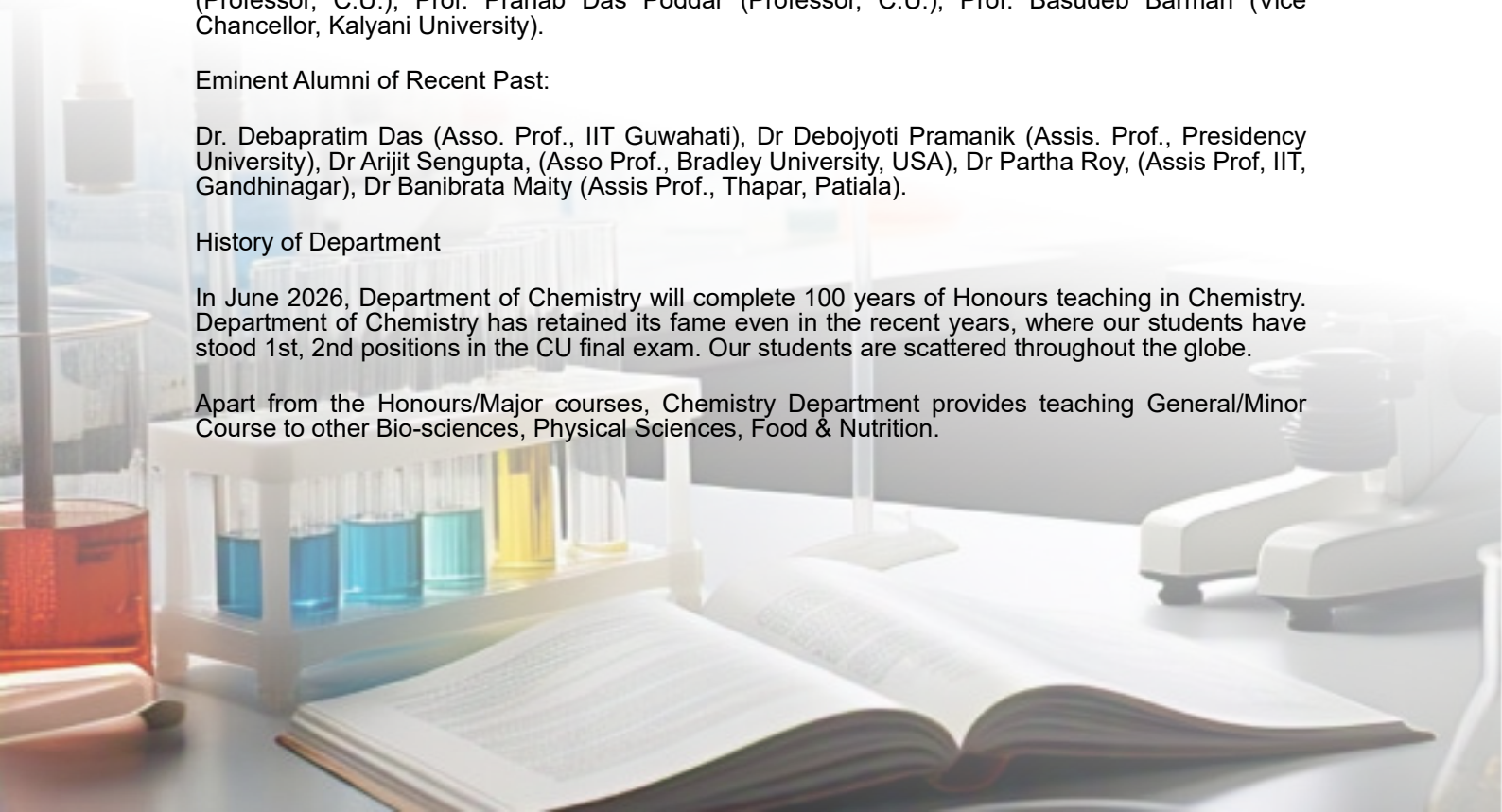

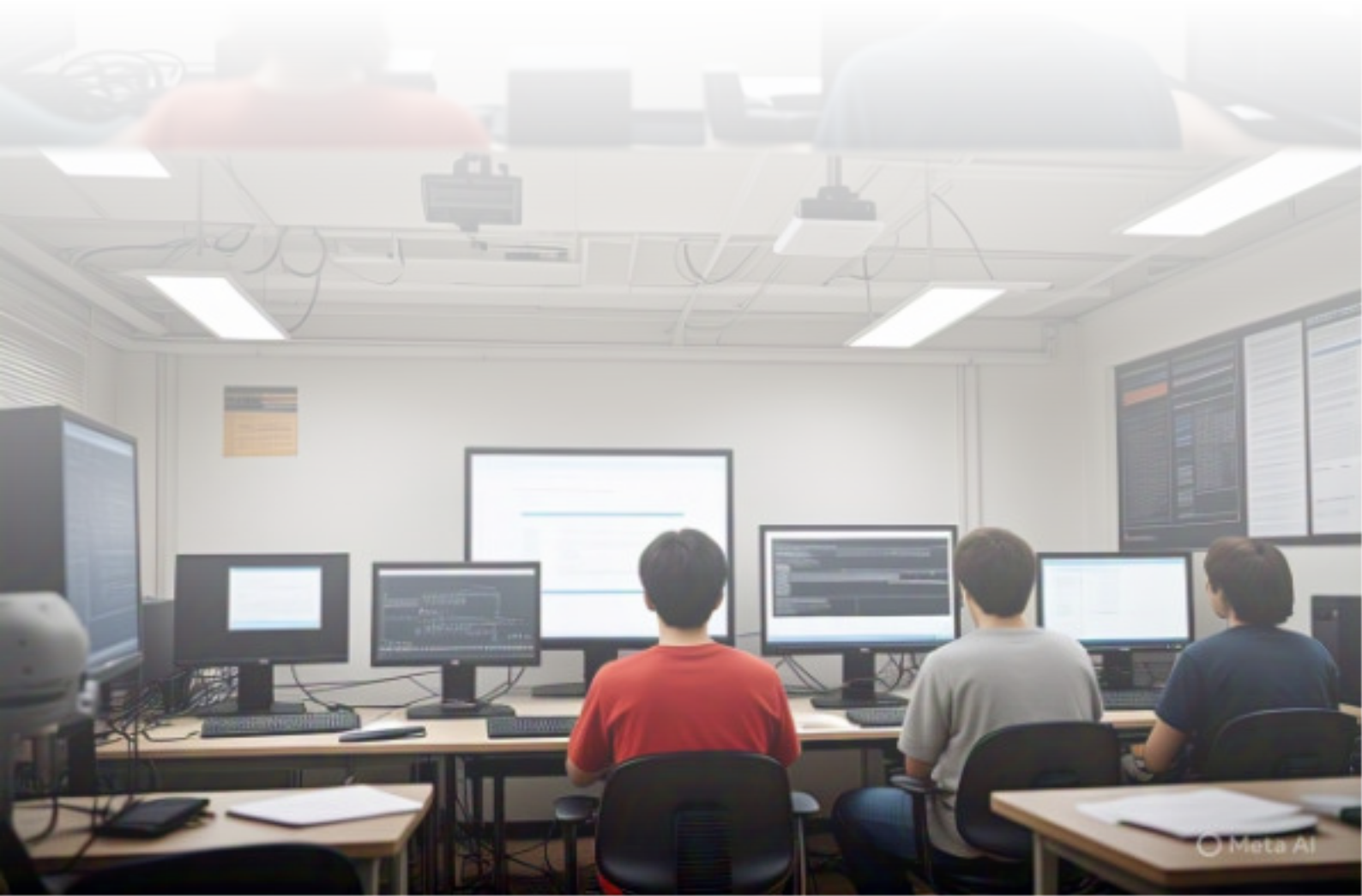

The Computer Science Department of Vidyasagar College was established as the degree pass level in 1996 (vide G.O. No.: 1(3)-hdn(CS) dt. 30th January 1996) by W.B H.E dept., C.S. Branch, Bikash Bhavan, Calcutta-91 . The department was housed in a tiny room in the third floor of the main building of the college. After getting affiliation from the University of Calcutta (vide no.: C/6262/63-Affl. Dt. 11th August 2004), the department was upgraded in 2005 to conduct Honours course in Computer Science. It acquired three rooms in the premises of the erstwhile students' hostel in the 19 Bidhan Sarani campus of the college. At present there are 5 members of the faculty including myself, and one Laboratory Attendant.

The present facilities offered by the department are hardware and software laboratory, and a teachers' room. Both the laboratories contain equipment necessary for conducting practical classes. There is a small departmental library having about 300 reference and text books.

About The Department

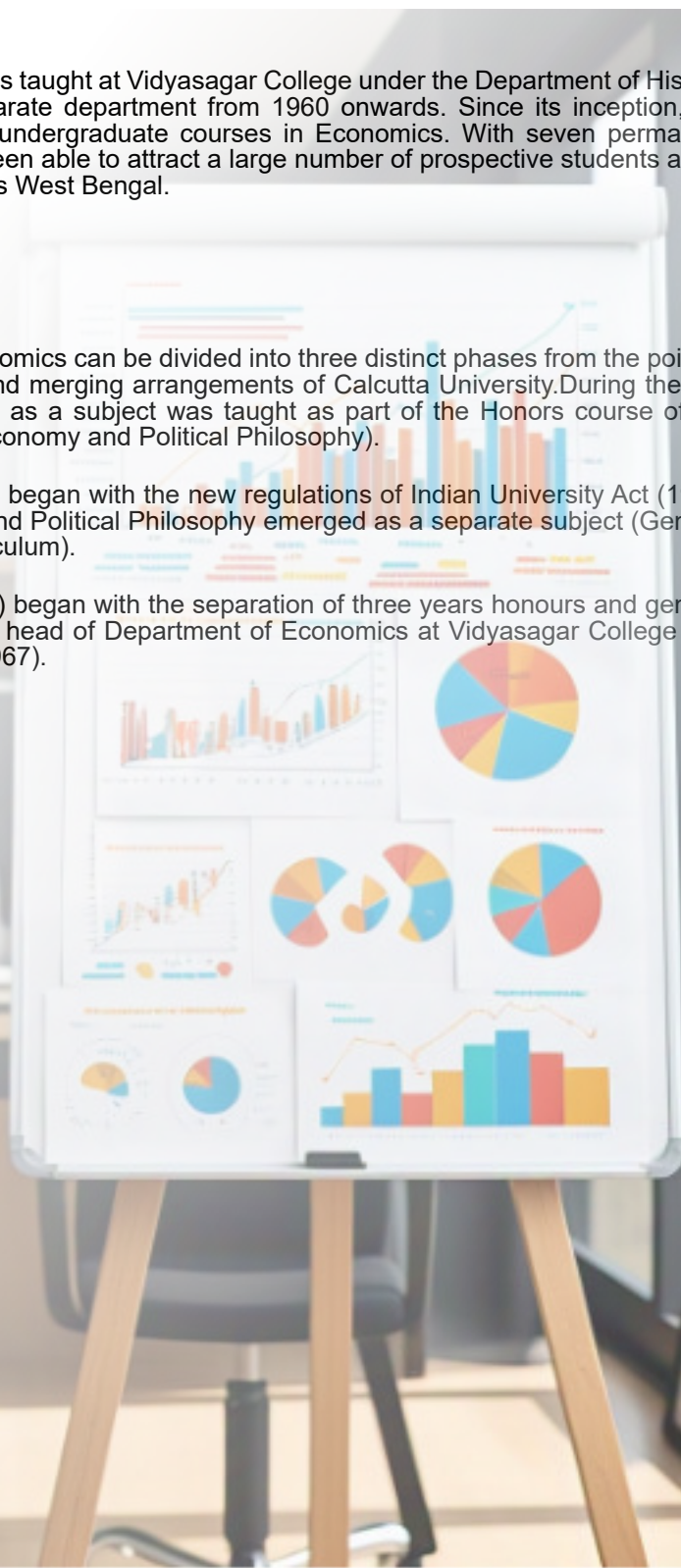
In the year 1872, Economics was taught at Vidyasagar College under the Department of History. It started to function as a separate department from 1960 onwards. Since its inception, the department has been offering undergraduate courses in Economics. With seven permanent faculties, the department has been able to attract a large number of prospective students at the undergraduate level from across West Bengal.

History of Department

The study and teaching of Economics can be divided into three distinct phases from the point of view of changing regulations and merging arrangements of Calcutta University. During the first phase (1872-1908), economics as a subject was taught as part of the Honors course of the History Department (Political Economy and Political Philosophy).

The second phase (1909-1959) began with the new regulations of Indian University Act (1904) from 1909. Political Economy and Political Philosophy emerged as a separate subject (General and Honors in BA and MA curriculum).

The third phase (1960 onwards) began with the separation of three years honours and general course for economics. The first head of Department of Economics at Vidyasagar College was Prof. Mihir Kumar Sen (1928-1967).

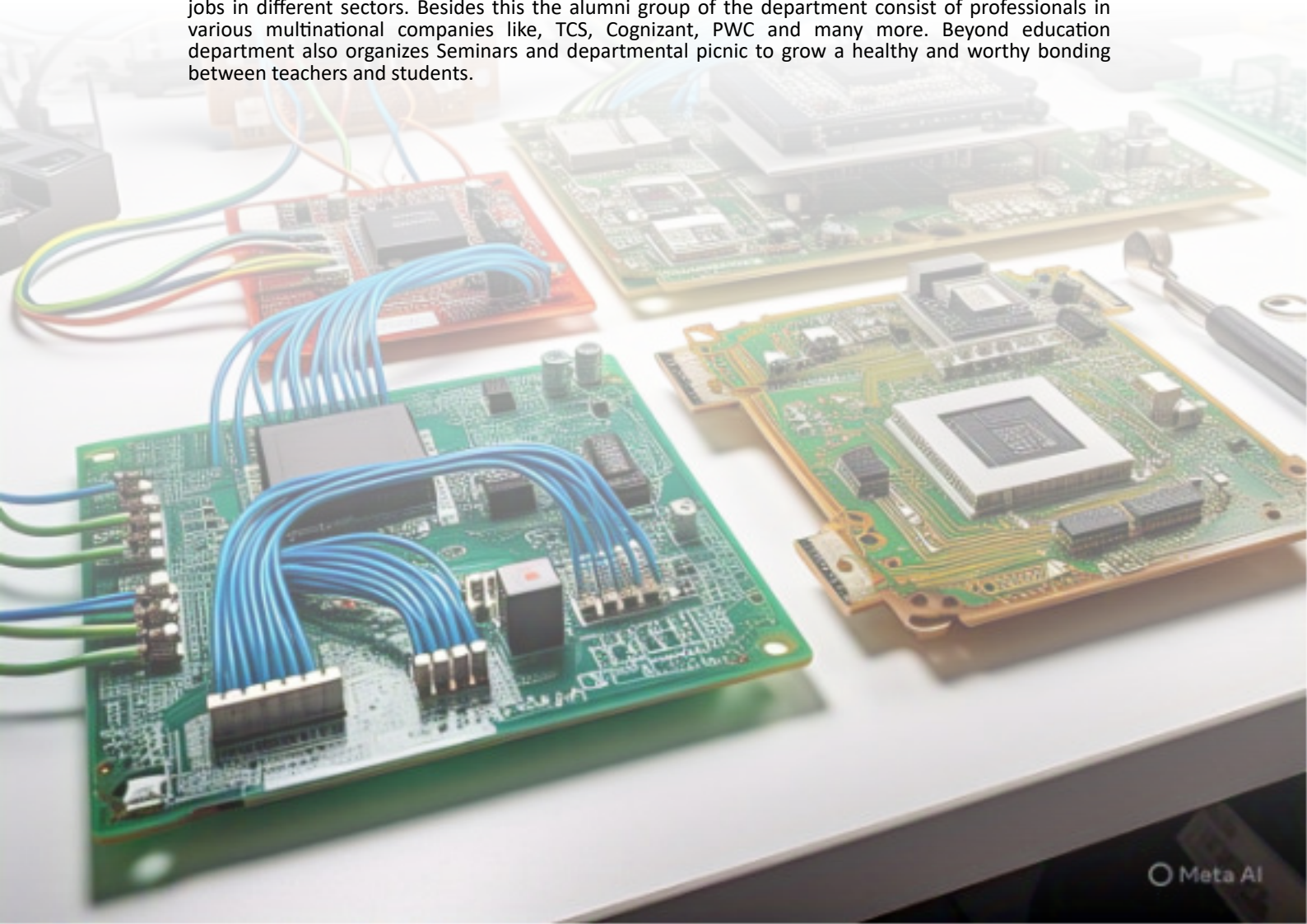

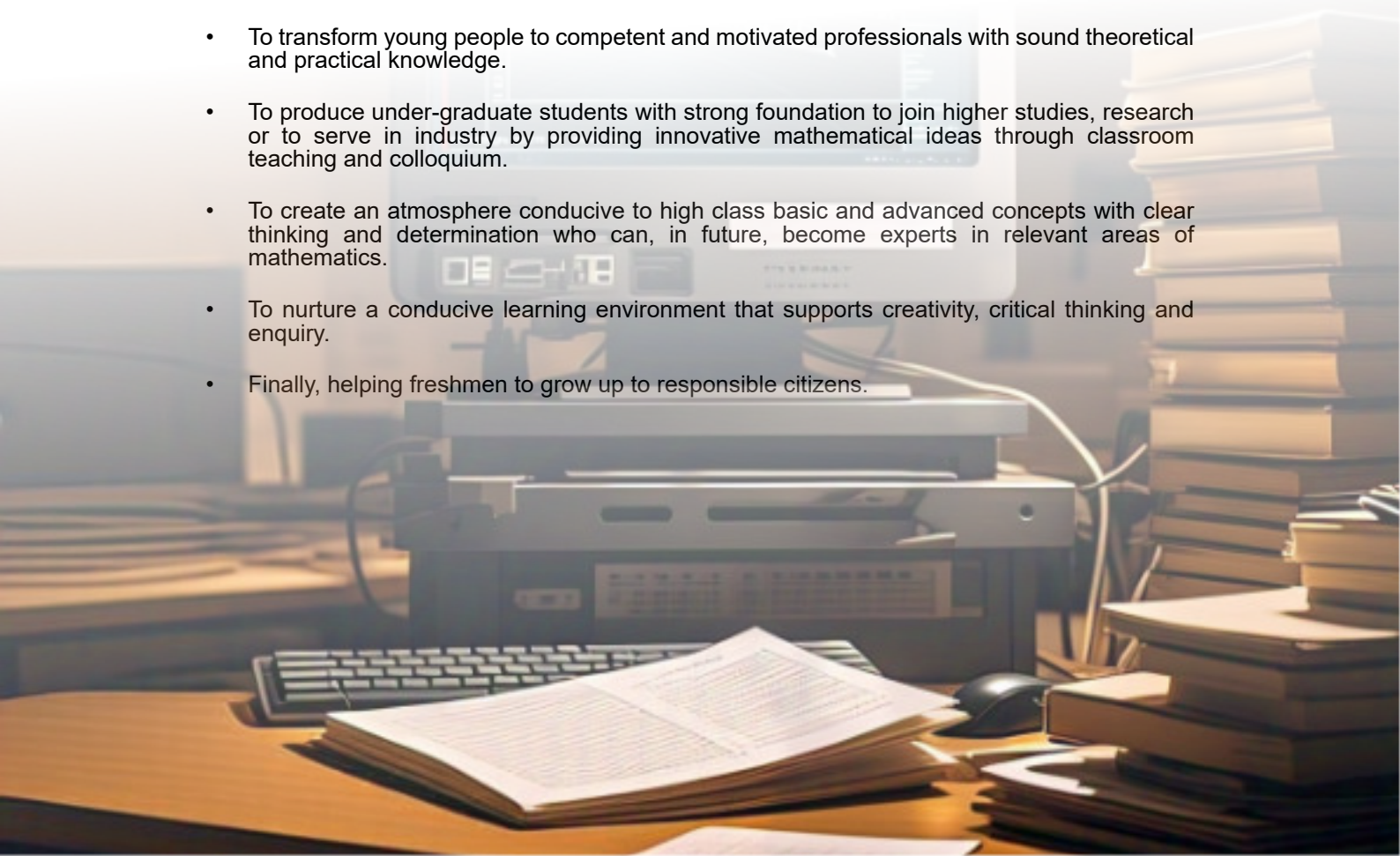
About The Department

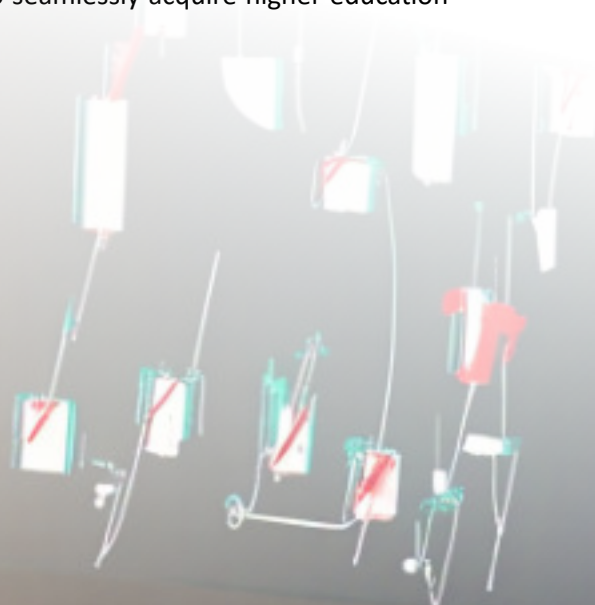
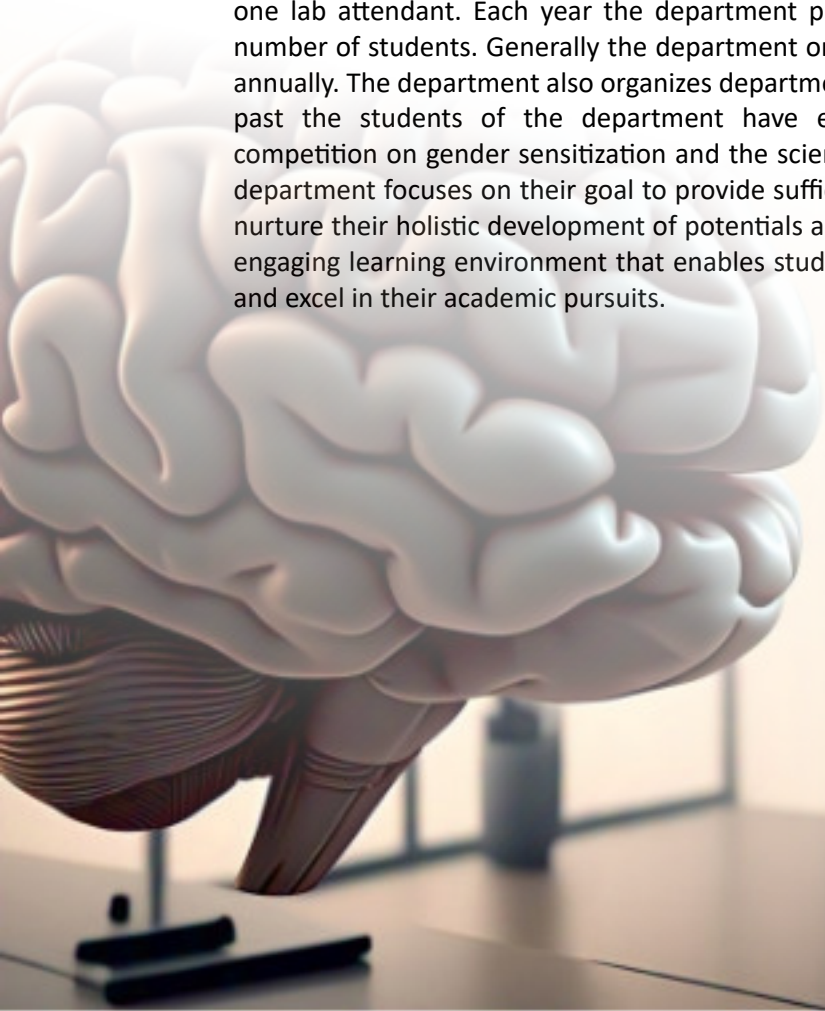

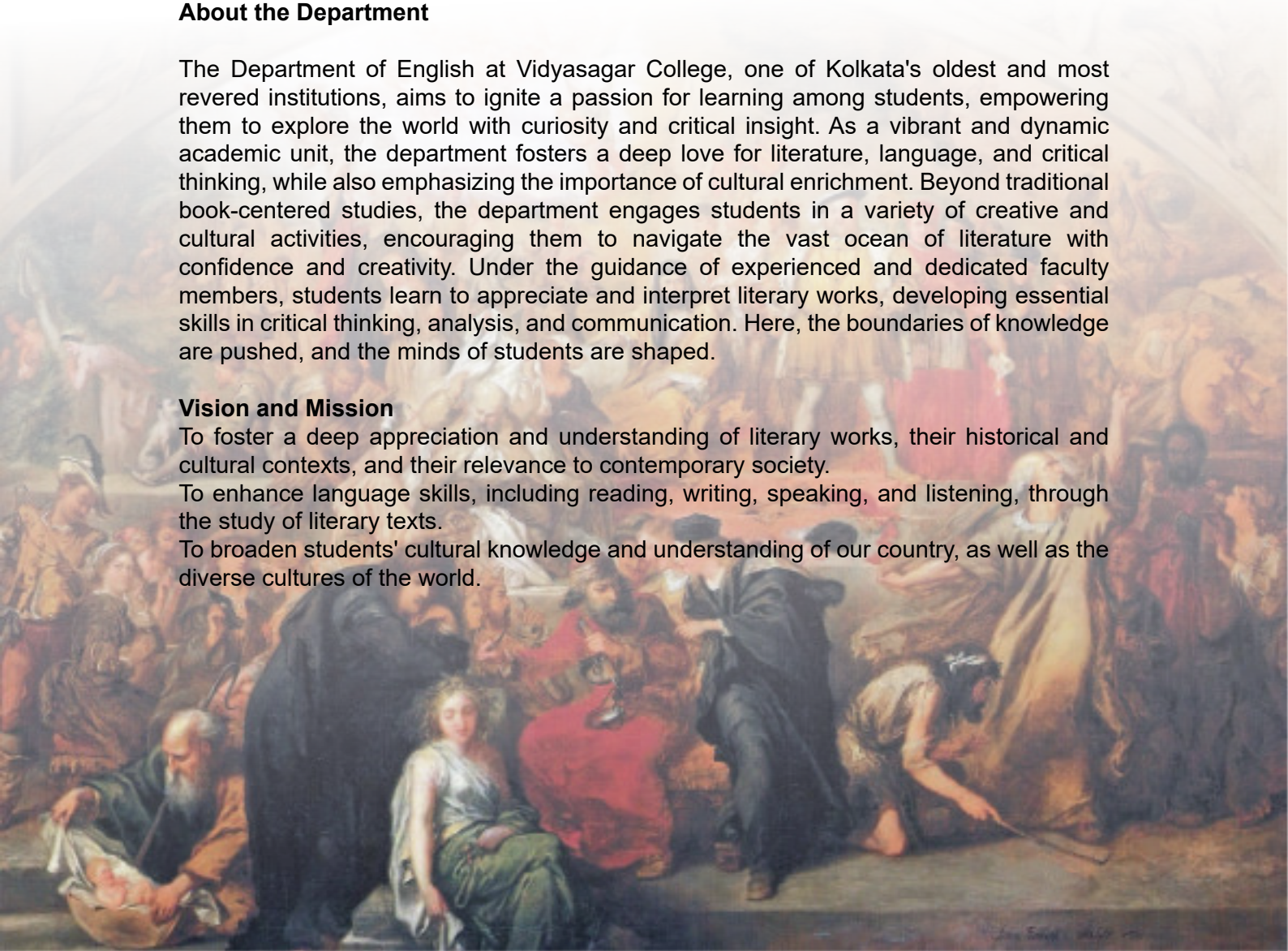

In the year 1887, the results of the B.A. and F.A. of the Calcutta University have been published “.....The Metropolitan Institution (Vidyasagar College) heads the list in Sanskrit” (Hindu Patriot, 23/05/1887). Lalit Kumar Bandyopadhyay awarded Eashan Scholarship (stood first among all Honours Subjects) as he was the only student who became First Class First in Sanskrit and also passed in First Class Honours in another subject. He also received Radhakanta Gold Medal in 1887. Later, Gopal Chandra Mishra, one of the famous students of this department, also awarded as Eashan Scholar in 1974. Dr. Gopal Chandra Mishra, Former Professor and Dean of Rabindra Bharati University and Former Vice-chancellor of Gaurbanga University, has served this department as speaker and invited lecturer. One of the alumnus of this department is Dr. Taraknath Adhikari who is also renowned scholar and Professor in the Department of Sanskrit, Rabindra Bharati University.

The Department is always trying to reach the top with the inspiration of Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar, the eminent Sanskrit scholar. This Department is the first who arranged the National Seminar and Workshop along with MHRD, New Delhi. Numbers of renowned Professors from different Universities have enriched the department with their valuable lectures and advices. The Department has pride for the achievement of the students.
